Policy Prohibiting Alcoholic Consumption

No alcoholic consumption or open containers of alcohol are permitted on the grounds. Noncompliance could result in immediate expulsion from the event, legal prosecution under local law or both.

Entries & Acceptance

No Entry For Exhibition Only

No entry "For Exhibition Only" shall be accepted, except as provided for in Chapter 10 when Intro Program classes are offered. See additional note for club policy regarding dogs that measure up.

General Rule on Eligibility

This event is sanctioned by the United States Dog Agility Association, Inc. ("USDAA").

This test is open to all persons with dogs being at least 18 months of age (14 months of age pursuant to Chapter 10 for Intro Program when offered OR for Sanctioned Match), regardless of pedigree or absence thereof, who have a current registration with USDAA and whose owners and the dog's handler are currently in good standing with USDAA.

Policy on Refusal of Entry

The Organizing Committee of an event may refuse the entry of any competitor or dog for just cause should the Committee view that participation by the competitor or dog could be prejudicial to the sport. However, in such case, the Committee must notify the competitor in writing upon receipt of entry, but in no case, more than three days following the event closing date for acceptance of entries. The burden of responsibility for the appropriateness of such action rests solely with the host group and its Organizing Committee.

NSF Check/Credit Card

Any check or credit card that is charged back by the bank or other financial institution may be assessed a service charge of up to \$40 per incident at the discretion of the host group.

Returned checks or credit card returns do not constitute a valid entry. Amounts shall be paid within 30 day of postmarked notice of the returned payment if such date follows the event date. Any fees not received within 30 days of notice will result in cancellation of event results for all classes related to the entry for which payment was made. No reinstatement of results is possible, and all awards must be returned within 10 days of notification or the dog's registration may be suspended pending restitution.

Any unpaid fees or shortfalls must be paid prior to the start of the event, or entry is canceled without recourse.

Refund Policy

There shall be NO REFUNDS for entries withdrawn after the closing date for acceptance of entries, for absentee, dismissal from the event as a result of disciplinary action, dismissal from a class, or for any other reason. Also, no entry fees will be refunded if the event cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, acts of terrorism, fire, "act of God", public emergency, strike, or any other cause beyond the control of the host organization.

Method of Payment

Payment of up to 25% of fees will be accepted for titling classes in Scramblers Dollars and/or Show Bucks. The remainder must be paid for in US Dollars (personal check). US Dollars (personal check) ONLY will be accepted in payment of entry fees for all tournament classes.

Refund Policy - Special Circumstances

Saguaro Scramblers will refund 75% of fees for bitches that come into season, injured dogs with a note from a veterinarian, or an injured handler with a note from a doctor.

Submission of Entries with Secondary Move-Up Date

All entries or cancellations must be received at the Secretary's address no later than the closing date, after which time no entries will be accepted or cancelled. For entries received by the closing date, the level of entry into a given class may be advanced by notifying the Secretary in writing via email by the "Secondary Closing Date". No other changes, cancellations or additions may be made after the initial closing date.

To be accepted, entries must be complete, signed (by parent or legal guardian if handler is a minor), received by the closing date and accompanied by the correct fees and include a valid USDAA registration number on a completed registration form.

Next-Day Move-Ups Allowed At This Event

Competitors earning a qualification during the Event that is needed to complete a title may advance their level THE NEXT DAY at the same event, i.e. move-ups on consecutive days ARE allowed.

Competitors are responsible for keeping accurate records of their qualifying scores and the judges from whom these scores were earned prior to this event to ensure that the dog is eligible to move up based upon scores earned at this Event. Competitors are advised to confirm scores earned with the scorekeeper and judge at the conclusion of a class to ensure the qualifying score has been accurately calculated and awarded in accordance with regulations. If for any reason it is determined that the score or previous scores were inaccurate, making the entry ineligible for the higher level class, any results (including awards) shall be forfeited and the entry will be deemed invalid without refund or other recourse.

Move-up forms supplied by this event must be used to notify the secretary BEFORE she leaves the site the day on which you earn your title.

Bitches in Season Allowed At This Event

Bitches in Season are ALLOWED to compete at this trial provided that the handler notifies the Trial Secretary in advance. A large protective mat must be used at the start line; running in protective britches will not be allowed for safety reasons. Sanitary britches must be worn at the trial site at all times except for a) while in the ring, b) while using the practice jump and c) while pottyng the dog. BIS are allowed to participate in all classes EXCEPT in Standard (because of the table). BIS will run at the end of each class and the handler must denote BIS on the gate sheet. BIS must be crated away from the main crating area. Please refer to USDAA.com for further information on the new BIS policy. Fix & Continue Allowed At This Event

Fix and Continue will be ALLOWED at this trial. A competitor may immediately repeat one obstacle other than a spread hurdle or long jump if it is faulted, or if the dog, in the competitor's sole discretion, did not meet their desired performance criteria. This will result in an Elimination, but handler/dog will be allowed to continue in flow with the rest of the course. Fix and Continue is allowed only once per run. A second occurrence of a fix, the handler/dog must immediately leave the ring. A handler may choose to reset a single bar hurdle for their "fix" attempt, but they must exit the ring immediately after performance of the hurdle. Fix and Continue does not apply to Gamblers or Snooker. Please refer to USDAA.com for further information regarding the new F&C policies. Check-in & Measuring

Dog Measurements & Certification

All dogs not jumping 24" in the Championship Program or 20" in the Performance Program at local and regional events must be measured unless they have permanent USDAA or World Cynosport Dog Registration status or a temporary card with 3 signatures as required by the regulations, making the dog eligible for their jump height (prior to 3 years of age). Please note that only dogs 18 months of age and entered in the event may be officially measured.

A Dog that Measures Up at Check-In FEO Not Allowed

If a judge's measurement of a dog at check-in establishes that the dog is ineligible for the height class in which entered, the competitor may

- Run the dog at the higher height in the same program based upon the measurement,
- Modify the entry to enroll the dog in the proper height class in the Performance Program,
- Modify the entry to enroll the dog in the proper height class in the Veterans Program if the dog is 8 years old

Dogs may NOT run For Exhibition Only (FEO) at this event.

Because entry into a higher height is permitted in the Performance and Championship Programs, a dog measuring lower may not be moved to a lower height in either program.

General Entry Conditions

Prohibitions on Aids & Devices

No leads, collars, food, toys or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at any time, except as provided for in Chapter 10 when Intro Program classes are offered, or in Chapter 8 when Junior Handler Program classes are offered.

Statement of Responsibility

Competitors alone are responsible for the behavior of themselves, their dogs, children, and guests. A competitor whose dogs, children or guests create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Event Organizing Committee, be asked to leave the test site.

Policy on Fault Limits

In the event of a larger entry, fault limits may be set at the discretion of the Organizing Committee and/or Judge without pre-event notice.

Spam Blocker

Confirmations will be sent via email using the secretary's address. If you have a spam blocker on your email account, please configure it to allow email from the secretary's address since confirmations will be sent from this account.

Class Descriptions

Titling Class Rules & Descriptions

One or more titling classes shall be held at this Event from those described in Chapters 3 - 8 of USDAA Official Rules & Regulations, which are downloadable from www.usdaa.com/rulesReg_eBook.cfm, and any amendments there to, which are downloadable from www.usdaa.com/rulesReg.cfm, each of which are hereby incorporated by reference.

Tournament Class Rules & Descriptions

One or more tournament classes are being held at this event, the rules and description of which may be downloaded on the Internet at www.usdaa.com/gen_formDoc.cfm, and are hereby incorporated by reference. A written copy may be obtained from the Event secretary.

Mixed-Height Pairs Entry Allowed

Dogs entered as partners in pairs relay at this event may be combined without regard to jump height, i.e. a mini dog may be entered as a partner with an open dog. Any pair consisting of at least one open dog must qualify in accordance with the QCT set forth by the judge of record for Open Pairs AND will be considered an open pair for placement purposes.

Veterans Program Classes

Veterans level classes offered at this event are open to a competitor with any dog that is at least eight (8) years of age as of the first day of this event. Previous experience in the sport sufficient to establish proficiency and confidence in performance is strongly encouraged. A dog entered in a Veterans class on a day may not be entered in that class in the Championship or Performance Programs. Masters Challenge Biathlon - Concurrent Titling Scores

The Masters Challenge (MC) & Performance Masters Challenge (PMC) Biathlon tournaments each consists of two classes; Standard and Jumpers. In addition to the combined score of these two classes being scored for tournament qualification purposes, each class will be scored independently in order to determine if title qualification has been earned for the MC and PMC standard and jumpers classes.

Prizes & Awards

Special Club Awards

MEAGHAN DEER CHASER WEICK MEMORIAL AWARD

Meaghan Deer Chaser was an outstanding Miniature Schnauzer owned by long-time Saguaro Scramblers club member, Ray Weick. Ray and Meaghan were an exemplary display of teamwork and sportsmanship. Throughout their career they had many accomplishments. They qualified in seven Grand Prix events, winning five. They ran in seven National semi-finals and one national final (1996). In 1996 they were also members of the mini-relay team which placed second. In July of 1994 Meaghan and Ray became the first team in Arizona to go MAD. In 1996 they earned their ADCH. In November of 1999 Meaghan was tragically lost in an accident. The Meaghan Award was instituted in the spring of 2000 and is awarded each year to the highest scoring Arizona Masters dog at the Saguaro Scramblers spring USDAA trial. The winner is calculated using standard runs only: standard course time – dog's time + faults; dog with the highest score wins.

DORMARTH MEMORIAL AWARD

Dormarth was a spunky Basset Hound owned by Saguaro Scramblers club member Gwyn Harney. Dormarth spent her career running in Performance demonstrating that being an athlete is more about heart and determination than physical ability. In 2003, she earned her PD3 title. Dormarth was the first, and so far only, basset to earn P3 titles in standard, snooker, and gamblers and in 2006 she became an Accomplished Snooker Dog. She was the first basset to have a qualifying run (first place!) in the Performance National Standard (Performance Grand Prix). Sadly, Dormarth died in March 2007 just a couple weeks after her last agility trial where she had a qualifying run in P3 gamblers, her favorite event. She was a fighter to the end. The Dormarth Award has been created by Saguaro Scramblers to honor the highest scoring Arizona Performance 3 dog at the Saguaro Scramblers spring USDAA trial. The winner must be a career Performance dog and not have earned any titles in the Championship program. The winner is calculated using standard runs only: standard course time – dog's time + faults; dog with the highest score wins.

Titling Class & Tournament Awards

TITLING CLASSES

- First through fourth place rosettes will be awarded in each jump height for all classes except Pairs, where ribbons will be awarded to mini and open divisions.
- A maroon qualifying ribbon will be awarded for those achieving a qualifying score.
- Titling ribbons will be awarded for those finishing a title.

GRAND PRIX & PERFORMANCE GRAND PRIX

- First through fourth place ribbons will be awarded in each jump height for the Grand Prix and Performance Grand Prix classes.
- A maroon and white ribbon will be awarded to those achieving a qualifying score in the Grand Prix, and a pink and white ribbon will be awarded to those achieving a qualifying score in the Performance Grand Prix.
- A regional bye voucher will be awarded to the first place qualifier in each jump height.

STEEPLECHASE & SPEED JUMPING

- Prize money will be computed based on 30% of the total entry fees and will be paid in the first and only round at this trial. Allocable amounts to finalist positions that are not filled for any reason will not be paid.
- Qualifying ribbons and prize money will be awarded in Round 1.

MASTERS & PERFORMANCE BIATHLON

- First through fourth place ribbons will be awarded in each jump height.
- A maroon qualifying ribbon will be awarded to those achieving a qualifying score.

TEAM / PVP AWARDS

- Rosette ribbons will be awarded to the top three (3) Teams/PVPs.
- Qualifying ribbons will be awarded to each team member of a qualifying Team/PVP.

ADCH or PDCH TITLES

- Special ribbons and poles will be awarded to anyone completing a championship title.
